Since our inception in 1997, Kids' Chance of Pennsylvania has provided over **632** scholarships for a cumulative total of **\$1,345,000**. Scholarships for the 2014/2015 school year were awarded to **55** students, totaling **\$158,500**. Many of the students, due to unfortunate circumstances beyond their control, would not have been able to attend college were it not for our support. The positive impact we are able to provide affects not only the student directly, but their families and communities as well.

We are very proud of our students. They exemplify the strength and ambition of our younger generation and the amazing potential of our country's future. One student succinctly stated:
